

- Trailer—purchased trailer to carry uniforms and instruments for concert and marching season.
- Video editing equipment—purchased so the band can make their own highlight videos.
- Liberty Bowl patches—1 for each student.
- Insight.com Bowl Highlight video—1 for each student.
- Sponsor 1 student for Chancellor's concert tour and purchase ad in program booklet.
- Held a post-Chancellor's Concert reception for alumni, band members and families.
- Provided breakfast for Concert Band members en route to the Harrisburg Legislative event.
- Provided \$1,000 scholarship to an incoming freshman since 1996.
 The scholarship award is \$4,000 after the matching funds from the Alumni Association and Office of Admissions is added.
- Purchase equipment for Alumni Band Day...drum sticks, mallets, oil, reeds, straps, etc.
- Print newsletters.
- Postage.
- Homecoming and Alumni Band Day food and beverages.

On April 7, 2001, at the Symphonic Band's annual Chancellor's Concert, the Northeast District Counselor of Tau Beta Sigma on the behalf of the Sorority's National Council presented Jack Anderson with the 2001 Paula Crider Outstanding Band Director Award. This award is presented to those college and university band directors who have distinguished themselves in the field of university bands and the purposes and qualities of Tau Beta Sigma. It is named for Paula Crider, who served as the director of the University of Texas Longhorn Band and a high school band director in Texas for 33 years. She was an active member of the Sorority's chapter at the University of Southern Mississippi and served as sponsor of the chapter at the University of Texas. She is a credit to those striving for excellence in the band field. Jack was nominated for the award by the Gamma Omega Chapter at Pitt and was selected by the National Council. He is only the second recipient of this very high honor.
